The artist Kaspar Laurenz (b. 1997) presents works in Kitzbühel for the first time with his exhibition *Autumn Impressions* at Untere Gänsbachgasse 10. The works accompany his return from Vienna to his Tyrolean homeland and translate the transformation of nature in autumn into color.

Kaspar grew up on the artistically influenced farm Schernfeichten in Kitzbühel. Thanks to his grandparents, Eva and Toni Hofer, the farm once served as the starting point for the establishment of the Kitzbühel Alpine Flower Garden and the farmers' market. Today, it is home to Barbara's porcelain studio.

During his studies in Vienna, Kaspar discovered painting as an expression of a deeply rooted creative impulse. Over time, the mountain motif became a central subject in his work, with a particular preference for snow-covered peaks.

The landscape paintings created in the years that followed reflect numerous journeys through Europe and Africa, before he returned to the mountains in the summer of 2025 and established his studio in Innsbruck.

The exhibition finds its home at the new STUDIO G10, which is establishing itself as an art and cultural space in Kitzbühel. On view are oil paintings of the Tyrolean mountain landscape, with a particular focus on the atmospheric colors of autumn. The exhibition is complemented by two works from Kaspar's ongoing series 36 Moods of the Wilder Kaiser, dedicated to the changing light of the seasons.

The ceramic vessels, incorporating Egyptian, Japanese, and Greek elements, reflect Kaspar's experimental working and creative process. This approach allows him to interpret landscapes through techniques drawn from different cultures and historical periods.

Autumn Impressions introduces a new artistic impulse into Tyrol's vibrant cultural landscape and will be on view in Kitzbühel from October 24 to November 1, 2025.
